eaching out beyond the borders of the science community and spreading the sphere of its influence are merely two of the remarkable changes in the efforts of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) together with its information arm — the Science and Technology Information Institute (STII).

The year 2010 silently witnessed all the changes that were slowly but surely taking shape in the scientific landscape of the country. For STII, using a more holistic approach to deliver its services became one of its major foci. Initiated in the preceding year, the changes became more pronounced in the numerous projects the Institute undertook and continues to undertake.

Working closely with the different DOST regional offices and with the indigenous people was not only a rewarding but also a learning experience. Conducting a strategic communication planning workshop with regional offices; sharing the trade secrets

in information packaging and dissemination; and reviewing a project for a group of indigenous people were but three of the innumerable successes reaped by the Institute in 2010; even going beyond its major final outputs. All these initiatives helped revolutionize the efforts exerted by experienced STII personnel leading to a more cohesive, focused, and 'out-of-the-box' way of thinking, planning, and implementing its varied projects and activities.

The year 2010 also witnessed the transformation of the Institute as it was successively managed by three Officers-in-Charge: Ms. Maribel Carag-Dario, Mr. Aristotle P. Carandang, and Ms. Elizabeth A. Fontanilla, until the appointment of Mr. Raymund E. Liboro as STII Director in September 2010.

Varied information-related development projects for and with other DOST agencies and offices were carried out with so much gusto that nearly brought the word excellence to the next higher plane.



# Information Services

#### **Clients Served**

Through STII's library services, S&T film showing, publications, photo and video service, and S&T releases

In 2010, STII served 269,797 clients.

This year, the Institute strengthened its strategies to deliver its services to a greater number of publics. The library staff attended to 220,448 researchers who used STII's library collection and facilities; attending to 216,955 online users and 3,493 walk-in, emails, postal and phone inquiries.

The Institute also received 1,724 students and teachers on field trip who viewed the services and programs of the Department of Science and Technology through S&T film showing. STII's printed publications reached 75,200 subscribers and readers.

Requests from various DOST agencies for video and photo reproduction totalled 29; while S&T releases reached 450 recipients.

# Databases and Information Systems Developed

# Giving clients quick access to information

The year 2010 saw the development and continuous upgrading of 11 information systems that were designed to make information easily accessible:

**science.ph** is a dynamic web search service facility that gives users access to specialized databases and various S&T-related information.

The Human Resource Management Information System (HRMIS) is a web-based application that manages personnel information, computes employees' compensation, tracks employees' daily attendance records and requests, and generates notifications and other reports.

The ScINET Integrated Library

Management System (SILMS) is a webbased application developed by STII that caters to



information handling, processing and services such as acquisitions, cataloging, Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) and generation of related reports.

The Records Management System (RMS) is a desktop application for managing institutional documents, paving the way towards an efficient and paperless document management

The **Document Tracking System (DTS)** is a web-based application that allows viewing and tracking of scanned documents, and delivering them online when linked with the RMS.

The *STII WebDB* integrates the databases, namely the Scientist, Filipiniana, and Institutions, to enable researchers to access online the profiles of scientists and S&T institutions in the Philippines, including the abstracts and bibliographic information of Filipiniana publications.

The **Payroll System** is a stand-alone system capable of producing payroll checks with appropriate withholdings, benefits, allowances, and deductions of employees.


Finance Management Information System

**(FMIS)** is an information system designed to manage budgeting, balance keeping and other financial-related operations.






The Library Users Registration System is a desktop application designed to facilitate the registration of library users by storing users' profiles and preferences.

The **STII Website** is the online portal for science news, institutional information, publications, and other official and administrative-related files; powered by Joomla!, a dynamic portal engine and content management system.

The *STII Webmail* is the official email facility for the Institute. It is powered by Zimbra, an open source server for email and collaboration tools.

The **Non-DOST Magna Carta System**, an online application tool for non-DOST agencies involved in S&T activities who would like to avail of the benefits of RA 8439 or Magna Carta for S&T Workers, was transferred to the Department of Science and Technology - Management Information System Division.



#### **Publications**

#### Bringing good news to various publics

In 2010, STII published 78 print and online publication materials. It has also maximized the use of social networking sites such as Facebook and Twitter; taking full advantage of social media services to publish information and connect with individuals, groups, and institutions quickly.

In order to share the good news from the Department, STII has maintained and improved its various in-house publications that include the following:

# Philippine Journal of Science (http://philipurnalsci.dost.gov.ph)

This journal is one of the six Thomson-Reuters (formerly Institute for Scientific Information or ISI)-covered journals in the country with an international reach that is available in print and online versions.

#### S&T Post (http://www.sntpost.dost.gov.ph)

This glossy magazine, designed for easy reading, carries positive S&T stories written in familiar language. It aims to inspire readers and make them appreciate the local S&T scene; available in print and online.

#### DOST Digest (http://www.stii.dost.gov.ph)

This monthly publication is designed to update our policy makers, including the movers and shakers, of the Philippine society on S&T developments; available in print and online.

#### **Balitang RapiDOST**

This monthly publication is designed to bring science news written in Filipino to the average citizens; available in print and online.

#### **DOST News Page**

STII maintains the news component of the DOST website. News, photos, and other information are regularly uploaded to update DOST's stakeholders, including the media





#### STII Facebook

STII's Facebook account facilitates the quick dispatch of news, photos, and announcements while eliciting feedback and allowing our network of contacts to expand.

#### Ignite the Mind Website

This site promoted STII's year-end activity named "Ignite the Mind" to the whole DOST community and facilitated online registration to program participants.

#### Ignite D Mind Facebook

This account enabled contacts to receive updates on "Ignite the Mind," exchange feedbacks, and post their own photos in the site, just as purposed.

#### Ignite D Mind Twitter

This account enabled STII to post updates on the "Ignite the Mind" activity to contacts and followers.

#### Spark

STII instituted the office-wide installation of this instant messaging system to enable STII staff to communicate quickly, monitor day-to-day attendance, and exchange virus-free files quickly. Spark also enabled us to work in less paper environment and post paperless announcements institute-wide.

#### Philippine Men of Science

Contains bio-bibliographical information about men and women who have excelled in their careers with their scientific and technological contributions published in various S&T publications here and abroad.











## **Trainings and Consultancies**

#### Sharing and transferring knowledge

Science-related information should not be kept away from the people. For STII, with its treasure trove of information that are with its people and in its library are valuable sources of knowledge that have been continuously shared to its publics.

In 2010, STII provided 29 trainings and consultancies in various areas such as:

- Training and installation of SILMS to help manage the library collections of the DOST -Food and Nutrition Research Institute, Nutrition Foundation of the Philippines, Philippine Carabao Center, and R&D Unit of the Philippine Army which also availed of the Spark instant messaging system.
- ICT services seminar-workshops to orient clients from the Batangas State University, University of Baguio, St. John Technological College of the Philippines, Philippine Central University and Far Eastern University.

- Document Tracking System to introduce its features to the Bureau of Internal Revenue.
- Science journalism to help promote the popularization of scientific information to DOST Region 1, Dumaguete City in Negros Occidental, Samar Island Press Club, and Western Visayas Agriculture and Resources Research and Development (WESVARRDEC).
- Technical writing for scientific journals to help publish the works of researchers at WESVARRDEC, Visayas State University, and DOST-FNRI.
- Communication plan preparation to strategize communication activities of DOST Regional offices.
- Implementation of R.A. 10055 at the Leyte State University.
- On-the-Job training programs to train students the rudiments of working in a science information institution. This year, we trained students from University of the Philippines Los Baños and Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng













Muntinlupa (science journalism), and Taguig City University, Polytechnic University of the Philippines on information processing and office administration.

- Moreover, the Institute's support team
  responded to 596 technical assistance requests
  for both hardware and software problems within
  the Institute, including technical support on
  network configuration to the R&D Center of the
  Armed Forces of the Philippines; developing and
  hosting the corporate website of the Nutrition
  Foundation of the Philippines to commemorate
  its 50th anniversary; and debugging the
  Enterprise Management Information System of
  the Philippine Economic Zone Authority.
- The ScINET Integrated Library Management System (SILMS), a home-grown integrated library management system, is continuously being improved. This year, STII added several features such as personal, corporate, meetings and conferences, geographic and uniform title in assigning subject headings to facilitate easier access to information.


# Making S&T information available and easily accessible

A number of improved services in the library of STII were initiated; some of which have been continuously maintained and upgraded. These include:

#### **Collection Development**

STII continued to enlarge its library collection with additional 1,435 titles of multimedia materials. To augment the collection, the library staff downloaded a total of 920,221 titles of full-text S&T materials from the IEEE and Science Direct subscribed databases. To make searching and retrieval of materials easier, STII catalogued and classified 628 multimedia materials with 2,496 assigned subject headings. A total of 668 titles of periodicals in 1,881 issues were received and recorded during the year.

Information analysis of S&T materials produced 1,798 abstracts; 1,576 indices; and 11,622 subject headings assigned to facilitate search and retrieval from the Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC), WebDB, and science.ph.



Databanking activities likewise added 5,800 new records and updated 14,096 and 1,713 records to the OPAC and WebDB, respectively.

### Library/Readers/Online Services

A total of 269,797 topics ranging from agriculture, biology, chemistry, physics, feasibility studies, investigatory project, climate change, global warming, and the like were accessed, retrieved and served to online and walk-in users. There were 14,856 issues of in-house publications that were distributed and delivered to various clients nationwide. Photocopying services brought in an income of P12,157.00 from walk-in library users.

#### **Promotional Materials**

# Developing creative, interactive, and innovative media


Unique to STII are its people handling creative works in crafting interactive and innovative promotional materials through its Communication Resources and Production Division. Among the different promotional materials developed in 2010 included the following:

- Information materials
  For the year, STII produced 160 information
  materials that were distributed to our channels
  and published in print and online or used as
  materials in broadcast over radio and television.
  Over 451 news and 32 photo releases were
  likewise edited, disseminated to media contacts
  and other networks, and uploaded over the
  Internet. Translated into Filipino, these materials
  were also used as broadcast releases.
- Audio-visual packages
   STII produced 16 audio-visual packages that were aired during major events such as the

National Science and Technology Week, National Biotechnology Week, launchings and agency anniversaries, and our year-ender "Ignite the Mind."

- Printed materials and forms
   Some 15 materials such as brochures, directories, business cards, and other materials were designed and produced this year.
- Other media (exhibits, banners, etc).
   STII produced four exhibit panels, tarpaulins, and other materials as support to major events of the year.
- Design of survey forms This year, STII designed two (2) survey instruments for the library: the Client Registration form and the Client Feedback form to capture client profile, perception, and other important information that will enable STII to easily identify library clients and provide quick response in terms of service quality.









## **Promotional Services**

What the Institute continuously undertakes is broadening the reach of S&T information. Promotional service goes with the promotional materials that STII develops. Promotional services undertaken by STII in 2010 proved beneficial in reaching to a greater number of Filipinos in various segments of society. Among these include 25 press conferences organized and assisted, and 99 other promotional activities conducted in 2010. There were also 797 radio and television interviews arranged and coordinated for the year.

For audio-visual technical services, STII rendered 179 video and photo documentations as its support to DOST agencies and offices. The Institute also continued the coordination of DOST MediaCore where four (4) meetings for DOST's inhouse media arm comprising information officers of DOST agencies and offices and including regional offices were done.



**DOST Mediacore** 


There was also an outreach project. STII conducted a study called "Youth Science Enterprise for Livelihood" (YSEL) which aimed to determine if YSEL can be replicated in other poor communities. In 2010. Beneficiaries of the YSEL project in Barangays Anabel and Betwagan in Sadanga, Mountain Province came face to face with the group from STII to review the project. Through focus group discussions and interviews using STII-developed instruments, the results of the study provided learning on and appreciation of the interplay of traditional practices with technology transfer initiatives. Future projects with similar nature are expected to enforce systematic implementation approach.

The news monitoring work enables the Institute to follow and document the frequency of published writeups. For 2010, STII was able to monitor 3,310 published news and features on DOST and its line agencies. These materials published in various newspapers and magazines through STII's media contacts and in-house writers should have had a total value of P41,530,478.14 but were actually published for free.

Other promotional/design services came about as STII participated and mounted exhibits in DOST technology fairs in the regions, which were held in La Sallete, Isabela; Puerto Princesa, Palawan; Dumaguete City; and Cagayan de Oro City.

Support to promotional services becomes imperative in order to smoothen flow of the services the Institute offers. In 2010, STII designed instruments and conducted surveys to gather relevant information on the profile and skills of 23 DOST information officers who are members of the MediaCore, and on the strengths, weaknesses and "wishlist" of each STII employee. The data generated in these surveys became valuable inputs to the management in designing programs, projects, and activities to enhance the communication, promotion, and information activities not only of STII but also of the DOST.





#### **Networks and Linkages**

Expanding the delivery of science information is what makes the STII relevant. The Institute has built partnership with various institutions for publications exchange, expertise sharing, training opportunities, collaborative projects, and other kinds of partnerships. STII's major network institutions and organizations include Nutrition Information Network of the Philippines in which STII serves as Vice Chair, Medical and Health Librarians Association of the Philippines, and the Philippine Science Journalists Association, Inc.


Moreover, STII is the coordinator of the implementation activities of the Science and Technology Network of the Philippines (SciNet-Phil) and Philippine e-Lib project.


For 2010, STII maintained its close partnerships with 119 local and foreign institutions and organizations, and 326 government offices, academe, state colleges and universities.

# Financial and Administrative Management

### **Financial Management**

This year, STII's total expenditure totaled P46,663,432.04. This amount includes regular allotment under the General Appropriations Act for CY 2010 (RA 9970) of P32,272,065.71, Continuing Appropriations (RA 9524) of P979,520.93, Terminal Leave Benefits for mandatory and optional retirees of P1,041,921.00, Miscellaneous Personnel Benefits Fund amounting to P1,760,000.00 (NBC 521) and P943,000.00 (NBC 524), both under the implementation of Executive Order No. 811 (Salary Standardization Law 3). Meanwhile, Performance Enhancement Incentives is totalled P336,000.00 while Grants-in-Aid Program summed P8,330,924.40.

Tables 1 & 2 show STII's Expenditures by Program/ Project/Activity and by Expense Class, respectively:

STII was able to generate revenues from sale of inhouse publications, reproduction of library materials and other fees and rentals as shown in Table 3.

# STII's value-added service outside its targets

# Modernization of the STII Library and Upgrading of the PSHS System Libraries

This project will take the STII Library to a higher level by upgrading its collection and equipping it with modern facilities such as ICT hardwares and softwares, wi-fi, touch-screen computers, and video equipment.

Improvements done in the year include equipping the library with three new high capacity application and data servers with large memory to perform autoindexing of the source databases and information systems. These state-of-the art servers generate faster response rate and delivery of search results. Likewise, STII acquired 26 additional units of PCs and a 40-inch television set which is now installed at the STII lobby showing various audio-visual presentations of DOST-developed and assisted technologies. The project also provided STII with wireless facilities and security cameras. It also set up an online registration for both walk-in and online library users.

Moreover, the project modernized and upgraded the library facilities of the PSHS system libraries across the country.

# Publication and Documentation of Technologies in DOST-SETUP Funded Projects

This project's output is a coffee table book of successful projects funded by the DOST- Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP). Aptly titled "SETUP Success", the book tells the story, through vivid photographs, of how 50 technology interventions helped clients gain business success.



# Corporate Folder of DOST Technology Application and Promotion Institute (TAPI)

This corporate folder serves as DOST-TAPI's marketing and promotional tool for its programs. It also has three fillers describing the programs and services of TAPI's technical divisions, as well as business card slip and CD pockets.

# Corporate Audiovisual Presentation of DOST -TAPI

This is a 15-minute AVP featuring TAPI's organization, programs and activities, including plans for the future.

#### **DOST-Region III SETUP Video Modules**

This project comprises seven video modules featuring DOST-assisted SMEs in Central Luzon. A project of the Pampanga-based Association of Government Information Officers of Central Luzon (AGIO-CL), the modules video-documented food, furniture, and machinery projects in Bulacan, Pampanga, Nueva Ecija, Zambales, Aurora, Tarlac, and Bataan.

#### **DOST-MIRDC Music Video**

The celebration of DOST's Metals Industry Research and Development Center's 40th anniversary last year featured the STII-produced MTV featuring MIRDC's employees, activities and other special events. The MTV used MIRDC's corporate hymn as background audio material.

#### Developing Appropriate Communication Intervention for S&T Promotion in the Regions

#### Support to Promotional Activities

The project developed appropriate communication interventions to effectively communicate programs and projects of DOST regional offices. In this project, STII's initial activity is a profile survey of the DOST regional offices' information staff and directors. STII developed two survey instruments for this purpose: one for regional information officers and another for regional directors. Data generated from the survey were used as basis in developing a module appropriate to the skills of the workshop participants.

The major output of this project is the "Strategic Communication Planning Workshop for Promoting S&T in the Regions" which culminated in the development of a five-year unified communication plan for all DOST regional offices. The plan was designed by DOST Regional Office 11.

#### STII Survey Series

STII assisted the development and data processing of a small registration survey conducted by the DOST Visayas Cluster. The survey was an offshoot of the "Strategic Communication Planning Workshop for Promoting S&T in the Regions." With 766 respondents, the survey revealed that exhibit viewers during the Visayas Cluster Techfair were dominated by 16-25 age group, majority of which are females. Most of the viewers were either from the non-government sector or business group.

STII also assisted in the survey conducted during the Mindanao Cluster S&T Fair in Cagayan de Oro City by orienting DOST scholar volunteers on how to properly conduct the survey and regional staff on how to encode the data using SPSS.

Despite the limited time and budget which a regular survey requires, the surveys succeeded in giving the host regions an idea on the age, sex, and affiliation of the crowd that the fair frequently draws during the three-day event. The survey series likewise gave the organizers an idea on the cost and needed preparation in conducting similar event evaluation in the future. The survey taught organizers that ample financial, time, and manpower resources are needed to produce more significant data using quantitative measures.

#### **Technical Assistance to DOST Events**

#### National Science and Technology Week 2010

As a support to this annual big event of the science community, STII developed exhibit materials, conducted a press conference, and produced full-documentation footage, pictorials, production of nine video clips. The NSTW project enabled STII to acquire a new video camcorder and a digital SLR camera.

STII's other support activities for NSTW included storytelling and emceeing at the DOST-National Research Council of the Philippines's "Science for Kids."

#### National Biotech Week 2010

For this national, interagency event led this year by the Department of Agriculture, STII's support included publicity through radio and television interviews with DOST officials and experts, web content management, press release preparation, full documentation of the weeklong simultaneous events, reproduction of DVD copies for the seven participating departments, media assistance in the press conference, updating of the MTV of the NBW Jingle, and production of a 20-minute video recap of the NSTW.

STII's support for these events with international participation and organized by the Philippine Council for Advanced Science and Technology Research and Development include proceedings documentation and photo-video documentation.

#### Gender and Development

STII staff attended and participated in the following activities: Women's Celebration on March 1 and 8, 2010; Orientation on DOST's Gender Mainstreaming Program and Gender Responsive Planning on March 23-24, 2010; and the Strategic Planning for GAD Mainstreaming of STII's Programs, Projects and Activities on October 27-28, 2010.

STII is among the DOST-GAD Pool of Trainers for the DOST GAD Mainstreaming Program which conducted Gender Orientation to the DOST agencies and regional offices and the Training for Technical Advisers on Gender Analysis (TOTAGA) for Provincial Science and Technology Directors (PSTDs) on Dec 6-8, 2010.

#### Science Council of Asia

STII actively supported the 10<sup>th</sup> Science Council of Asia held 13-16 June 2010 under the auspices of DOST's National Research Council of the Philippines with the theme "Meeting the Health Challenges in the Asia Pacific Region: Responding through an Integrated and Multidisciplinary Approach in Science and Technology." STII assisted various SCA-related activities such as press conferences, documentation, preparation of news releases, and others.

In this activity led by the Philippine Council for Industry and Energy Research and Development, STII assisted by giving inputs to the roadmap being prepared by an interagency committee.

#### DOST - Balik Scientist Program

Under the Office of the Asst. Secretary for Technology Transfer, the DOST-BSP is assisted by STII by way of media relations and preparation of news releases.

## **Events Organizing**

#### DOST-wide Ignite the Mind Project

The STII-led Ignite the Mind project was conceived to provide a venue for the whole DOST system to converge and participate in various contests and presentations. STII, in coordination with and cooperation of, DOST offices and agencies, handled the pre-registration, program and its flow, emceeing, documentation, tokens, AVP preparation, and invitation to some special guests. The successful event awakened the esprit de corps of attendees, promising an energized performance of DOST personnel in 2011 and beyond.

#### Malacañang Salute for GMA

STII prepared a special AVP for the Malacanang salute to the former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo attended by representatives from various national government agencies. The AVP featured significant contributions of DOST to the Arroyo administration, particularly in economic development and human resource development through its scholarship programs and support to small and medium

enterprises through SETUP, Technicom, and other programs.

# Youth Science Enterprise for Livelihood (YSEL) Community Beneficiaries

The second phase of YSEL project aimed to determine if the project is worth replicating in other poor countryside communities. STII organized a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) and In-depth Interviews held 6-10 December 2010, and developed four instruments (three for the FGD and one for the interview).

YSEL succeeded in making more mothers, farmers, some students, and other community members believe that they can embark on a business to improve their income, basing on the experiences of other people who succeeded in their businesses.

Because of said findings, the YSEL team recommended certain adjustments in identifying proper beneficiaries and enforcing a more systematic approach to implementation, should a project similar to YSEL be implemented in the future.

## **Inter-Agency Involvements**

Inter-Agency Core Group on Nuclear Energy

Two representatives from STII have been invited to be part of the Public Information and Consultation Team of the Inter-Agency Core Group on Nuclear Energy. The team comprises representatives from DOST's Philippine Nuclear Research Institute, Department of Energy, and National Power Corporation. Some of the accomplishments of the team in 2010 include the 1) carrying out of the Nuclear Energy Perception Survey in nine provinces nationwide, 2) Media Orientation Seminar and Plant Visit spearheaded, and 3) Workshops on the development of a Communication Plan.

Also part of this inter-agency collaboration are media consultation and site visit to the Bataan Nuclear Power Plant.


#### Celebration of the 2010 International Year of Biodiversity


